TROPHIES: up to 50 dogs in the class: 1st place 51 – 75 dogs: 1st and 2nd places over 75 dogs: 1st, 2nd and 3rd places **ROSETTES: 15% in all classes** Clear round rosettes available

ELIGIBILITY AND SCHEDULE OF CLASSES

Only first prizes and points gained in standard classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows may be used for progression through the classes. (A dog is only eligible for one grade). In defining the eligibility of the owner or handler for Grade 1, the three jumping wins and points progression referred to in the definition apply only to one dog and not an accumulation of dogs.

For owners, handlers or dogs which have not gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows. In defining the eligibility of the owner or handler for Grade 1, the three jumping wins and points progression referred to in the definition apply only to one dog and not an accumulation of dogs.

Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grades 1,3,4,5,6,7, and have not gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows, or elected to progress on points from Grade 1. N.B. Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 2 (Starters) are not eligible for this class.

Grade 3

Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grade 1 or 2 or have elected to progress on points from Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and dogs which are not eligible for Grade 4, 5, 6 or 7

Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 3 or elected to progress on points from Grade 3 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grade 3, 5, 6 or 7

Grade 5

Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 4 or elected to progress on points from Grade 4 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grade 3, 4, 6 or 7

Grade 6

Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 5 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grade 3, 4, 5 or 7

Grade 7

Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of 4 first places at Grade 6 at Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows, two first places must be gained in Agility (not Jumping) Classes.

CLASS STRUCTURE: A class may either be held as a graded class or a combined class. A graded class may be scheduled for one or more consecutive grades with separate results and awards issued for each grade. A combined class may be scheduled for more than one consecutive grade with one overall set of results. More details may be found at

VETERAN:

These classes are aimed at dogs over 9 years old on the day of the show that still enjoy agility, but are no longer able to jump their full height. They should not have jumped full height 2 months prior to competition. These classes may consist of standard equipment with the exception of the tyre and weaves. All dogs will jump small heigh (35cms). A Lower height may be offered, depending on equipment.

ANYSIZE:

These classes are open to dogs not entered in any other class at the show (except other anysize classes). It is particularly suitable for inexperienced dogs or handlers, and dogs that are unable to compete at their own height for any reason. These classes may consist of standard equipment with the exception of the weaves and tyre. All dogs will jump small height (35cms). A Lower height may be offered, depending on equipment.

SHOW REGULATIONS

- 1. Dogs entered at Kennel Club licensed Agility shows must be registered at the Kennel Club in accordance with Kennel Club Regulations for Classification and Registration B. The registration number/Authority to Compete number will be required for each entry.
- 2. Entry Fee £2.70 per dog per class, £1.25 for Bretford DTS members.
- 3. Separate entry forms must be completed by each Competitor and must be signed by the Competitor or his authorised agent in accordance with the provisions specified thereon. Entry forms must be accompanied with the appropriate fees.
- 4. Puppies under 18 calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible to compete for Kennel Club licensed Agility Tests. Not for Competition entries will be accepted for dogs aged 4 calendar months and over. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and they must be Kennel Club registered.
- 5. Competitors are reminded that the Show Committee has the right under Kennel Club Regulation to refuse any entry.
- 6. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
- 7. No bitch in season is allowed to compete.
- 8. No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at any time within the boundaries of the Show.
- 9. Dogs must not wear any type of slip, half-slip collar or lead when under test. Only a flat, close fitting, leather or webbing collar is permitted, providing the only attachment is a plain identification panel as an integral part of the collar ie. not attached by a ring.
- 10. Should a judge be unable to fulfil the appointment to judge, the Committee reserves the right to appoint another judge.
- 11. No competitor shall impugn the decision of the Judge or Judges.
- 12. Dogs will be received at any time.
- 13. Kennel Club standard marking will apply.
- 14. Judges at an Agility Show may not enter for competition a dog which is recorded in their ownership or part ownership; or handle a dog at the Show at which they are judging.
- 15. Height of Jump obstacles will be as follows: Large dogs 65cm, Medium dogs 45cm, Small dogs 35cm, Veteran / anysize 35cm Competition for Large dogs for dogs measuring over 43cm at the withers

Competition for Medium dogs - for dogs measuring over 35cm and measuring 43cm or under at the withers

Competition for Small dogs – for dogs measuring 35cm or under at the withers

- 16. Withdrawal of dogs from Show. A dog shall be withdrawn from competition and removed from the Show if it is:
- (a) A bitch which is in season
- (b) Suffering from any infectious or contagious disease
- (c) Interfering with the safety or chance of winning of an opponent
- (d) Of such temperament or is so much out of hand as to be a danger to the safety of any person or other animal
- (e) Likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues competing.
- 17. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including 25 days before the start of the competition shall be counted when entering for any classes. (14/06/11) For these purposes a competition shall be defined as all classes covered within the same schedule. In the event that a dog becomes eligible for the next grade at a particular show, after the entry for that show has been sent, it is the competitor's responsibility to notify the show secretary at least 14 days before the date of the show (27/06/11). The dog will then be moved into the appropriate class/es for the next grade. The dog will be moved into the corresponding number of classes as were entered at the lower grade. (Any Grade changes should be emailed to paul.sensky@longhedge.co.uk)
- 18. It is the competitors' responsibility to be available for their class and running orders will be strictly adhered to.
- 19. Handlers working more than one dog in a class must ensure that the dogs compete in the sequence in which they are drawn. Failure to do so may result in elimination.
- 20. Should circumstances so dictate, the Club, in consultation with the Judges, may alter arrangements as necessary. All such changes and the circumstances surrounding them will be reported to the Kennel Club.
- 21. All competing dogs must, at the time of entry for the Competition, be registered as required by the Kennel Club Rules & Regulations in the Competitor's name (or registration or transfer applied for). In the case of a partnership, the full name of every partner must be given. In the case of dogs recorded as owned by a limited company, the directors and secretary of the limited company will jointly be considered for the purpose of the Regulations. A dog acquired subsequent to entry having been made at a Competition, may compete as the new owner's property provided that an application for the transfer has been forwarded to the Kennel Club before the Competition, and the new owner has undertaken to abide by the Regulations and Conditions of the original entry form.
- 22. Animals in Event:. No animal other than one officially entered shall be brought into the precincts of the event during its continuance, except any dogs registered to assist the disabled, or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes or by permission of the Club Committee. However, at the discretion of the Show society, a dog brought to the show by a spectator may be admitted into the precincts of the dog show with the proviso that those in charge of the dog sign a declaration confirming the dog is free from disease and that the dog will be kept under proper control at all times.
- 23. In the event that the show is cancelled due to unforeseen circumstances, the society will refund fees, less reasonably incurred expenses, on receipt of a stamped, addressed envelope submitted within 1 month of the show/trial date.
- 24. All dogs will be entered at this Show at their owner's risk, and whilst every care will be taken, the Committee will not accept responsibility for the loss, damage or injury howsoever caused to dogs, people or property whilst at this Show.
- 25. No dog will be allowed in the ring at any time other than when being judged, no practising will be allowed in the ring. Food shall not be carried in the hand or given to a dog in the ring.
- 26. No dogs suffering from infectious or contagious disease or having been exposed to such disease during the period of 21 days prior to the Competition may compete. Competitors infringing the Regulation will be liable to be fined and/or dealt with under Kennel Club Rule A42.
- 27. Internet entries will be accepted via www.ddise.co.uk
- 28. No prize money will be given.
- 29. Please clean up after your dog and place mess in the bins provided. Anyone knowingly not doing so may be asked to leave the venue and forfeit any remaining classes.
- 30. Please remember also, that if the sun is shining, your dog is vulnerable and at risk in a hot car.

Please remember to leave ventilation and water available for your dog in your car.

Anyone whose dog is at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.

DOGS IN CARS ON HOT DAYS

Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.

- When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
- If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
- The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
- Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
- When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
- Keep the dog in the shade take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
- Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time. Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.
