1. This class must be judged under the appropriate Kennel Club Rules in force at the time of the competition
2. If the entry for a heat exceeds the KC limit for a judge in a day then the class will be equally and randomly split and another judge appointed for the second part.
3. All competitors entering the class will be deemed to have agreed to abide by the rules of the Kennel Club and the specific regulations governing this class.
4. The competition is open to Kennel Club registered dogs eligible to compete at Large Height Grade 3, 4 & 5.
5. Handlers may enter more than one dog in the competition and may qualify more than one dog for the final event.
6. Once a dog has qualified for the final it may enter further heats, as long as it is still eligible for Grade 3, 4 or 5.
7. Handlers who have already qualified their dog for the final must report this fact to the appropriate Show Secretary before running in the class. If the already qualified dog then qualifies again, the place will be awarded to the highest placed unqualified dog.
8. The first five dogs from the heat will be invited to compete in the final. The next five dogs will be held as reserves.

THE KENNEL CLUB OLYMPIA MEDIUM DOG AGILITY STAKES

This competition will be classified as combined Grades 1 to 7 and judged under the Kennel Club regulations for standard classes.

Competitors may enter more than one dog in a heat and may qualify more than one dog for the semifinals.

Handlers may only qualify one dog for the final which will be the highest placed dog at the semifinal.

Once a dog has qualified for the semi-final/final, further heats may be entered for competition although any placings in these further heats will not affect the dog's eligibility for the final/semi finals. The first two previously unqualified placed dogs will be invited from each heat to compete in the semifinals which will be held at The City of Birmingham Championship Dog Show at Stoneleigh. The first ten highest placed dogs at the semi-final will be invited to compete in the finals to be held at Olympia. Those dogs eligible to compete in Medium dog competition are those measuring over 350 mm (1 foot 1¾ inches) and those measuring 430 mm (1 foot 5 inches) or under at the withers and eligible to compete in combined Grades 1 to 7 for Medium dogs.

3. All competitors entering the class will be deemed to have agreed to abide by the rules of the Kennel Club and the specific regulations governing this class.

5. Handlers may enter more than one dog in the competition and may qualify more than one dog for the final event.

An Agility competition for pairs of large dogs grades 3 –7 combined using a steeplechase style course. The class must be judged using current Kennel Club rules and a course laid with a baton change between handlers.

Class Title Skinner's Sevens Steeplechase Pairs Large Grades 3 –7 Combined SpecialClass Style Spectator attractive steeplechase course with jumps and tunnels (no weaves) and MUST contain at least 1 Skinner's Spread (a rising spread set at maximum size). Course must contain maximum/minimum 17 obstacles and a hand to hand baton change behind the line. Mishandling the baton change 200 points penalty. Entry 2 dogs and 2 handlers enter the competition and take part as a Conditions competitive partnership. No changes are possible once entry to each heat closes or to the pairs that qualify. **Qualifiers** Each host venue provides 7 winning pairs to take to the final. 1st –7th places. Only the first 7 pairs qualify. No reserves are needed. Notes1) Handlers can qualify any number of dogs for the final who will run in draw order.2) The partnership (2 dogs and 2 handlers) qualify so should one dog or handler of the pair be unable to take part in the final the pair cannot compete.3) Only pairs that qualify at each heat will be invited to the final. With over £1000 in competition prize money each heat will offer the chance to 7 winning pairs to be invited to the Autumn 2012 final.

ANY SIZE Jumping

Dog Vegas Large Agility Grade 6 Qualifier – supported by First Contact

The “Dog Vegas Qualifier” is a competition for Large dogs, eligible for Grades 6

There are **ten qualifying heats**. The top 5 dogs from each heat (top 3 if the heat is split into 2 parts), will qualify for the “£ Dog Vegas £” Grand Final comprising of approx 50 at the July Dog Vegas show in 2012.

1. This class must be judged under the appropriate Kennel Club Rules in force at the time of the competition
2. If the entry for a heat exceeds the KC limit for a judge in a day then the class will be equally and randomly split and another judge appointed for the second part.
3. All competitors entering the class will be deemed to have agreed to abide by the rules of the Kennel Club and the specific regulations governing this class.
4. Handlers may enter more than one dog in the competition and may qualify more than one dog for the final event.
5. Once a dog has qualified for the final it may enter further heats, as long as it is still eligible for Grade 6.
6. Handlers who have already qualified their dog for the final must report this fact to the appropriate Show Secretary before running in the class. If the already qualified dog then qualifies again, the place will be awarded to the highest placed unqualified dog.
7. The first five dogs from the heat will be invited to compete in the final. The next five dogs will be held as reserves.
8. If the class is split the top three dogs from each part will be invited to compete in the final. The next top three in each part will be held as reserves.
9. In the event of a dog being unable to compete in the final due to unavailability, illness or injury the reserves from that heat will be called up in numerical order.
10. In the event of a handler being unable to compete in a heat due to **illness or injury** a substitute handler for the qualifying dog will be allowed to run the dog.

Eligibility and Definition of Classes

This classification should apply to competitions for large, medium & small dogs. In the following definitions of classes First Prizes or other prize wins are those gained in standard classes at any Kennel Club licensed Open agility shows (i.e. limited agility shows, special classes & invitation events excepted). Only a first place with a clear round will count towards grade progression. Societies may schedule classes other than those defined below. The eligibility for “special” classes must be defined by the society & included in the schedule. The word “special” must be included in the title of the class. Agility classes to include contact points & jumping classes where there are not contact obstacles. With this proviso classes are defined as follows:

Class Structure: a class may either be held as a **Graded class** or a **Combined class**. A Graded class may be scheduled for one or more consecutive grades with separate results & awards issued for each grade. A Combined class may be scheduled for more than one consecutive grade with one overall set of results.

Progression: Progression from each grade will require one agility win or three jumping wins at that grade, except the progression from Grade 6 will require 4 wins at Grade 6, two of which must be agility classes. Results from combined classes will only count towards progression from the dog’s current grade.

Points Progression: at the handler’s discretion a dog may progress up to grade 5 by winning 75 points at each grade, using the Agility Warrant points scheme, regulation K3.c refers, except that there is no requirement for a minimum number of agility points. If this method of progression is selected, the handler must ensure the show secretary signs the dog’s Agility Record Book at the first show entered at the higher grade. There is no time limit on this progression, however, once a dog has progressed, it cannot return to a previous grade.

Only first prizes & points gained in standard classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows may be used for progression through the classes. (A dog is only eligible for one grade).

Grade 1 (Elementary)	For owners, handlers or dogs which have not gained a first place in an agility class or three first places in jumping classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows. N.B. Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of grade 1 (Elementary) are not eligible for this class.
Grade 2 (Starters)	For owners, handlers or dogs which have qualified out of Grade 1 but have not gained a first place in an Agility Class or three Jumping Classes at Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows. N.B. Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 2 (Starters) are not eligible for this class.
Grade 3 (Graduate)	Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grade 1 or 2 or have elected to progress on points from Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows & dogs which are not eligible for Grades 4, 5, 6 or 7.
Grade 4 (Novice)	Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three Jumping Classes at Grade 3 or elected to progress on points from Grade 3 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grades 3, 5, 6 or 7.
Grade 5 (Intermediate)	Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three Jumping Classes at Grade 4 or elected to progress on points from Grade 4 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grades 3, 4, 6 or 7.

Grade 6 (Senior)	Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three Jumping Classes at Grade 5 or elected to progress on points from Grade 5 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grades 3, 4, 6 or 7.
Grade 7 (Advanced)	Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of four first places at Grade 6 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows, two first places must be gained in Agility (not Jumping) Classes.

Rules and Regulations

KC Rules and Regulations

- Dogs entered at KC licensed Agility shows must be registered at The Kennel Club in accordance with KC regulations for classification and registration B, or else registration or transfer of registration must have been applied for. The registration number/Authority to compete (ATC) number will be required for each entry.
- Entry - £2.85 per dog per class, "working NDDAC members £1.00 per class Camping is £10 per night or £35 for Wed 6th Thur 7th, Fri 8th & Sat 9th June 2012. All entries to be made via the Show processor "Longhedge Show Processing" Working NDDAC members Free camping.
- The committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
- Dog under 18 calendar months of age on the first day of the show are not eligible to compete at KC licensed Agility Shows.
- Not for competition entries will be accepted for dogs aged 4 calendar months & over. Dogs must be KC registered with their details recorded on the entry form.
- No bitch in season is allowed to compete.
- No person shall carry out punitive, corrective or harsh handling of a dog at any time within the boundaries of the Show.
- Dogs must not wear any type of slip; half-slip collars or leads when under test. A flat, close fitting, leather, or webbing collar is permitted, providing the only attachment is a plain identification panel as an integral part of the collar i.e. not attached by a ring.
- Should a judge be unable to fulfill the appointment to judge the committee reserves the right to appoint another judge.
- No competitor shall impugn the decision of the judge or judges
- Sponsors: Showoffs Rosettes, Rosettes 1st to 6th & 1st place trophy, First Contact Rosettes 1st to 15th & Trophy to 1st place. Pawstrading rosettes 1st to 15th & Trophy to 1st place. Skinners Seven Rosettes 1st -7th twice (14) Trophies 1st -3rd twice (6) Prize Money 1st only £17 each. Kennel Club Medium Olympia Rosettes 1st to 10th
- Kennel Club standard-marking regulations shall apply
- Anysize & Veteran jump heights will be 36cm (14") and 22cm (9")
- The Height limit for dogs. A) Large Dog Classes for dogs measuring over 430mm at the withers. B) Medium Dog Classes for dogs measuring over 350mm and measuring 430mm or under at the withers. C) Small dog classes for dogs measuring 350mm or under at the withers.
- Judges at an Agility show may not enter for competition a dog, which is recorded in their ownership or part ownership; or handle a dog at the show at which they are judging. Dogs will be disqualified if proved to have been handled by the scheduled judges spouse or immediate family or resident at the same address at the judge.
- Withdrawal of dogs from competition: A dog shall be withdrawn from competition and removed from the show if it is:-
 - A bitch in season.
 - Suffering from any infectious diseases or contagious disease.
 - Interfering with the safety or chance of winning of an opponent.
 - Of such temperament or is so much out of hand as to be a danger to the safety of any person or other animal.
 - Likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues competing.
- In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including 25 days before the START of the competition i.e. (14th May 2012) shall be counted when entering for any class. For these purposes a competition shall be defined as all classes covered within the same schedule. In the event that a dog becomes eligible for the next grade at a particular show, after the entry for that show has been sent, it is the competitor's responsibility to notify the show processor at least 14 days (25th May 2012) before the date of the show. The dog should then be moved into the corresponding number of class(es) as were entered at the lower grade. If there are fewer or no classes available for the next grade the competitor should be offered a refund of the relevant entry fees.
- Should circumstances so dictate, NDDAC, in consultation with the Judges, may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes and the circumstances surrounding them must be reported to the Kennel Club.
- In the event that the show is cancelled due to unforeseen circumstances, the society (NDDAC) will refund fees, less reasonably incurred expenses, on receipt of a stamped address envelope submitted within 1 month of the show date.
- Food shall not be carried in the hand or given to the dog in the ring.
- Should the judge deem a re-run is required, any result and/or faults gained in the previous run must be discounted
- Separate entry forms must be completed by each owner and must signed by the owner or his authorized agent in accordance with provisions specified thereon. Entry forms must be accompanied by the appropriate fees.
- Free passes are not applicable at this show.
- Competition of Dogs Suffering from Contagious or Infectious Disease - No dogs suffering from infectious or contagious disease or having been exposed to such disease during the period of 21 days prior to the Competition may compete Competitors infringing the Regulation will be liable to be fined and/or dealt with under KC rule A42
- It is the competitor's responsibility to be available for their class and running order. Competitors must run as close to their running order as possible. Failure to do so may be reported to the KC.
- Animals in Event. No animal other than one officially entered shall be brought into the precincts of the event during its continuance, except any dogs registered to assist the disabled, or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes or by permission of the General Committee. However, at the discretion of the show society, a dog brought to the show by a spectator may be admitted into the precincts of the dog show, with the proviso that those in charge of the dog sign a declaration confirming the dog is free from disease and that the dog will be kept under proper control at all times.
- All dogs registered and resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete (ATC) number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without a Kennel Club Registration number or an authority to compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
- A pay on the day class may run if time and weather permits
- A practice ring may be available to dogs entered for competition at the show, if space allows. This ring must be supervised by a responsible adult with agility knowledge.
- Welfare of Dogs. An exhibitor (or competitor) whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not knowingly put their dogs' health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. A breach of this Regulation may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and regulations.
- Dogs entered are at the owners risk and whilst every care will be taken by NDDAC Committee, officials & sponsors will accept no responsibility for loss, damage or injury howsoever caused to dogs, persons or property whilst at the show.
- RTD cheques will incur an extra £10 charge..
- If a refund is requested by a competitor :- a) Any entries that have been received and processed, then cancelled before the closing date of the show will be refunded with a deduction of the processing costs per entry plus £1.54p to cover the cost of postage and bank charges for cashing and issuing the refund cheque. B) After the closing date, no refunds will be given.
- No unclaimed rosettes will be posted, unless the competitor sends a SAE.
- Competitors must follow the instructions of the Stewards with respect to parking, camping and conduct within the show boundaries.
- Whilst every care will be taken, NDDAC will not accept responsibility for loss, damage or injury to persons, dogs or property whilst at the show.
- All caravans/camping units must carry suitable fire extinguishers and facilities for fire fighting.
- Please clear up after your dogs. Anyone knowingly not doing so will be asked to leave the showground forfeiting any remaining entries.

39. Adults who accompany children are responsible for their children's behavior, actions and safety

40. **Max 3 DOGS** PER PERSON TO BE TAKEN ONTO THE EXERCISE AREA AT A TIME

41. Competitors who allow their dog/dogs to make excessive noise during unsociable hours will be requested by the show manager to keep them quiet. Failure to do so would result in the competitor being required to leave the venue within 1 hour of the decision of the show manager.

DOGS IN CARS ON HOT DAYS

Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.

- When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
- If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
- The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
- Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
- When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
- Keep the dog in the shade – take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
- Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.

Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.

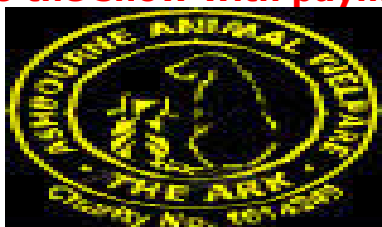
